"I am the vine you are the branches." (John 15.5)

"In heavenly love abiding"

At age five I was taken to live with my maternal grandparents. An earliest memory was lying on the verandah surrounded by bunches of grapes that hung from vines attached to it. It was a little private world. Some years later, when the vines were removed, I remember feeling very sad.

In this Gospel passage Jesus emphasises the need for continued connection between Himself as the root of the vine, and those who draw strength from Him as its branches: "Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me" (v.4). Jesus uses the word "abide" or "abides" no fewer than eight times in today's short passage ($\underline{John\ 15.1-8}$). Later in the excerpt from his first letter, John picks up this theme again, using the same words a further six times: "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them" ($\underline{1\ John\ 4.16}$).

It seems that in this passage John also sees a need to remind the 'branches' of their responsibility to love one another. For example, problems emerge if we as branches begin to focus on ourselves, "my branch has more fruit than your branch", instead of on the vine (Jesus) from which we all must draw our common strength.

Focusing on our perspective as branches while maintaining a strong connection to the vine has proved a challenge for Christians through the ages.

St. Mark the Evangelist

Last Thursday, 25th April, the church celebrated the Feast of St. Mark the Evangelist. As with the other evangelists, we give thanks for their witness in the gospels and we hope to draw inspiration so that we too might proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The Gospel of St. Mark is the shortest of the four gospels. The story moves quickly, almost breathlessly. A seminary classmate of mine memorized the entire Gospel, and he used to travel and recite the entire Gospel of St. Mark from memory. It took just over an hour, and though everyone knew what was going to happen, the audience would be on the edge of their seats. "And immediately..." keeps the reader going at a brisk pace.

The urgency of St. Mark's witness is palpable. We modern Christians might learn something from this and make haste to share the Good News of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. Indeed, it is in this Gospel that Jesus commands his followers to preach the Gospel to the whole creation.

Some years ago, I travelled to Venice. There you can visit St. Mark's Basilica, where tradition says that the body of St. Mark is kept. I find it very inspiring to visit the sites of veneration of biblical figures; somehow this connects for me the ancient and the modern, the heavenly and the earthly. To venerate the relics of St. Mark is to profess faith that the evangelists were living, breathing people with a living story to proclaim.

How can you celebrate St. Mark? You can read the whole of St. Mark's Gospel in one sitting. Perhaps you'll do that! Or maybe you will consider how his witness might inspire you to be an evangelist in your community.
